Report of Education Needs for the purpose of Assessment of Need (Disability Act 2005)

Introduction

The Assessment of Need (AON) is a statutory process under the Disability Act (2005) whereby the Health Service Executive (HSE) reports on the health and education needs of a child/young person. All children/young people born on or after 1st June 2002 are eligible to apply for an Assessment of Need (AON) under the Disability Act (2005).

The AON commences when the parent/guardian makes an application for their child to the HSE.

Background

If the HSE Assessment Officer forms the opinion there may be a need for an education service to be provided to an applicant, they will request the NCSE to nominate persons with the appropriate expertise to assist in carrying out the assessment of education needs.

On receipt of a request from the HSE Assessment Officer, the NCSE will first contact the parent or legal guardian to acknowledge receipt of the request from the HSE Assessment Officer, confirm current school details and to confirm parent/legal guardian consent.

The HSE obtains consent from the parents/legal guardians before any action can be taken to progress with the Assessment of Need. This consent allows the sharing of data from education service providers with the HSE and NCSE.

The NCSE will then contact the school principal nominating them to complete the NCSE Report of Education Needs.

The school principal can nominate the deputy principal, class/subject teachers and/or the special education teachers to assist in the completion of the NCSE Report of Education Needs.

Purpose

This Guidance Note has been written to help you to complete the NCSE Report of Education Needs. For more information, please consult the Department of Education Circular 0025/2024.

Assessment in Education

Assessment in education is an integral part of teaching and learning and involves a wide variety of means by which the strengths and needs of students are identified. Assessment is carried out by the teacher(s) who have responsibility for the student, but may also be carried out in collaboration with the Special Education Teacher(s). Assessment in education is not synonymous with testing.



NCCA guidelines (2007) describe assessment as 'the process of gathering, recording, interpreting, using and reporting about a child's progress and achievement in developing knowledge, skills and attitudes'. Teachers in all settings, including mainstream, special classes and special schools, use a range of assessment approaches to identify and meet the student's education needs, appropriate to the age and developmental stage of the student, and to review progress.

Completion of the NCSE Report of Education Needs for the purpose of Assessment of Need (Disability Act 2005)

Teachers, typically, will have comprehensive information on the education needs of individual students, through interactions with them on a regular basis in the school context. All of this information may be included in the NCSE Report of Education Needs. Some of this information may be recorded in the Student Support File. However, the teacher is not limited to providing information from the Student Support File where they consider additional information to be relevant to the AON.

Teachers can reflect on their own knowledge and experience of working with the child to outline education needs that may not be recorded in the Student Support File, but which are deemed relevant to assisting in carrying out an assessment of education needs.

Teachers may identify, and are free to give their professional opinions and views, if any, of the child's education needs that they consider could be met by the provision of education services that are not available in the school. In identifying education needs and services, teachers should not be constrained by the cost, availability or capacity to provide for that need/service, in either their own school or another recognised school or centre of education. As per section 8(5) of the Disability Act 2005, the assessment of education needs is to be a resource blind 'gold standard' assessment.

New and newly-enrolled students

If the school is nominated to complete a NCSE Report of Education Needs for a junior infant student, those completing the report should proceed based on their current knowledge of the student and any other information from the Early Learning and Childcare setting where received.

In the case of a newly-enrolled student, where information is not available, the principal should ask the parents/legal guardians to complete the consent form (appendix 1). The completed consent form gives the current school permission to contact the student's previous school, Early Learning and Childcare setting, home tutor or other relevant party to request a copy of relevant information, such as the student's Student Support File or Mo Scéal report. The sharing of this information will assist the current school to complete the NCSE Report of Education Needs for the purpose of the Assessment of Need.

The NCSE will specify the preferred date by which a school is asked to return the NCSE Report of Education Needs to comply with the HSE Assessment of Need process.

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¹ Under the Disability Act 2005 s. 8(5), the assessment must be carried out without regard to the cost of or the capacity to provide, any service identified in the assessment as being appropriate to meet the needs of the applicant concerned. It thus will indicate the "gold standard" of service requirements.

This section provides details of:

- The assessment approaches and other professional reports used to identify additional education needs
- The identified additional education needs for the student

Section 3 – Services and Details of Nominated Persons

- Allows for additional comments or views on the education services required to meet the student's needs
- Details of the nominated persons
- Confirmation and signature of the school principal/deputy principal
