During 2019 service providers were procured and appointed to carry out the planning stage design of the road infrastructure on the core bus corridors including technical engineering design, transport impact assessment, and environmental impact assessment, for purposes of making statutory planning applications to An Bord Pleanala. The work of identifying the preferred route options for the sixteen radial core bus corridors was substantially completed during 2019, with a view to running a second public consultation in early 2020.
