The Department presented an update on Technical Working Group. The Valuer Code of Practice has been discussed. The penalty point system is to be abolished and the introduction of an independent panel will be introduced. There was a good discussion on the quality scoring and categorisation. Revised Valuer Guidelines to be circulated before the next meeting and any comments should be forwarded to Aishling Cronin.
