- With regards to like for like, to match every animal 3, 4 lactation is difficult to do. Better genetic merit; exact replica hence animal for animal
- The proposed cap would be across all compensation schemes
- DAFM to request figures from Teagasc regarding costing for Hardship Grant (not to be depicted as full picture as not an accurate calculation)
