Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM) Information Notice on the Marketing of Free-Range Eggs after the Avian Influenza Precautionary Confinement of Birds is lifted on 18 April 2023.

- This notice is to clarify the requirements for the labelling of "Free Range Eggs" from the 18th of April 2023 when the requirement to confine/house poultry and other birds as a precautionary measure against avian influenza will be lifted.
- Eggs laid from 18 April in Free Range systems where flocks are allowed access to the range will no longer require over labelling as "Barn Eggs".
- Eggs laid, up to and including 17 April, will require over labelling as explained in trader notice No 2 of 2023.

Notes:

- Avian Influenza (Biosecurity measures) Regulation 2022 <u>remains in force</u>.
- All flock owners are legally required to maintain best practice biosecurity measures.
- All flock owners intending to allow birds to have outdoor access from 18 April 2023, must take action now to ensure areas conform to best biosecurity practices.
- Farmers are urged to remain vigilant and maintain strict biosecurity.
