1. Purpose

The purposes for which the Department processes your data are:

- to set up the meeting with the guidance counsellor and for logistical purposes such as sending the meeting link to your email address/letting guidance counsellors know who they are meeting at what time; and
- for reporting at the end of the service, using anonymised data.

2. Legal basis

The lawful bases we rely on for processing your personal data for this purpose are:

- Article 6(1)(e) of the GDPR: "processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller"; and
- Section 38 of the Data Protection Act 2018, which allows for personal data to be processed lawfully where it is "necessary and proportionate for the performance of a function of a controller conferred by or under an enactment or by the Constitution...". In this case, the function performed by the controller is set out in the Education Act which provides at section 7(1)(c) that it is a function of the Minister to plan and coordinate support services, which are defined in section 2(1) as including "guidance and counselling services".
