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#### FORESHORE ACTS 1933 TO 2011 - GENERAL GUIDANCE NOTES

The Foreshore Acts require that before the commencement of any works or activity (including the erection of any structures) on State-owned foreshore a licence or lease must be obtained from the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine for works undertaken on the foreshore which are deemed to be:

- any function in relation to a fishery harbour centre,
- any function in respect of—

(i) an activity which is wholly or primarily for the use, development or support of aquaculture, or (ii) an activity which is wholly or primarily for the use, development or support of sea-fishing including the pro-

(ii) an activity which is wholly or primarily for the use, development or support of sea-fishing including the processing and sale of seafish and manufacture of products derived from sea-fish.

Such a lease or licence is subject to an annual rental payable to the Exchequer. Foreshore is the land and seabed between the high water of ordinary or medium tides (shown HWM on Ordnance Survey Maps) and the twelve-mile limit (twelve nautical miles is approximately 22.24 kilometres).

Applicants for a lease or licence are urged to consult the Department well in advance of finalising their proposals. <u>An application for a lease or licence must</u> <u>be accompanied by 10 copies</u> (15 copies if there is a possibility of significant impact on the marine environment and any project requiring an EIS) of each of the following documents and be sent to:

- 1. Completed application form.one with original signature.
- 2. Ordnance Survey Map of 1:2500 (latest edition) showing the precise area and the hectarage involved below the line of high water of medium tides clearly marked on the Map in distinctive colour. Applicants must certify and date all maps submitted, stating the area of foreshore involved in metric measurements (i.e. hectares or square kilometres etc). Plan, elevation and sectional drawing showing clearly the nature of the proposed works and lines and levels of high and low water of Spring tides.
- 3. Longitudinal section showing clearly how such works will be laid in relation to the surface of the seabed and having delineated on it the lines and levels of high and low water of Spring tides.
- 4. Certified copy (only 1 copy required) of the Company's Memorandum and Articles of Association and Certificate of Incorporation of a Limited Liability Company/Rule Book/Constitution for a club or Co-Operative Society as appropriate to the particular circumstance.

Additional copies or any or all documents may be requested to facilitate examination by the Department's specialist advisors.

Applicants are required to publish notice of their proposals in newspapers circulating in the area. The Department will prepare the notice and specify the newspapers in which it should be published. A four week period is allowed for representations and objections to be made to the Minister. The applicant is allowed an opportunity to comment on these before the final report is made to the Minister. The report will detail the proposal, the process that has been gone through, objections and commentary on them, and recommend whether or not to grant a lease or licence and if so under what conditions.

Certain developments are subject to the European Communities (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations, 1989 to 1999. An application for any development above the relevant threshold in the Regulations must include an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). Applicants are encouraged to seek the Department's opinion at the scoping stage of the EIS. An appraisal of the environmental effects of a development below the threshold must be submitted by the applicant to allow the Minister to decide whether it is likely to have significant effects on the environment. Where the decision is "yes" an EIS is mandatory. The public consultation period for an application requiring EIS is 8 weeks and a copy of the EIS must also be provided by the applicant to the consultative bodies named in the European Communities (Foreshore) Regulations 2009 [SI N° 404 of 2009].

**Developments on the foreshore require planning permission in addition to a Foreshore Lease/Licence/Permission**. All Foreshore Leases, Licences and Permissions are without prejudice to the powers of the local planning authority. Applicants should, therefore, consult initially with the local planning authority

regarding their proposal. In the case of developments on foreshore for, by or on behalf of a Local Authority where an EIS is required, applications should be made to An Bord Pleanála under **Part XV**, **Planning and Development Act 2000**. 10 copies of any applications made under this Act must be sent to this Department at the time of application to An Bord Pleanála.

Applicants seeking permission to lay an outfall or discharge pipe on the foreshore should also apply to the local authority or the Environmental Protection Agency for a licence under the Local Government (Water Pollution) Acts.

Developments on privately owned foreshore also require the prior permission of the relevant Minister under the Foreshore Acts.

Priority will be given to cases where emergency works are required for the preservation of human life. In such cases the Department should be contacted immediately by an application form with the required documents and drawings made available by whatever means allow for speediest arrival, with an undertaking to comply with any advice or instructions given by the Department. These completed applications would be dealt with as a priority in accordance with standard procedures, but it may be necessary for the Department to require modification of works carried out or their replacement with more permanent works of a design and nature acceptable to the Minister.

## 2. (A) A detailed description of the proposed works which are to be carried out on the foreshore. (Please feel free to use additional sheets, which should be signed and dated).

The original quay wall at Burtonport built in the 19th century to accommodate steam ships requires refurbishment as it has settled and deteriorated over time to the extent that it is now in a failed state. Fines continue to wash out from behind the qauy wall and the extent of movement from settlement will inevitably lead to collapse of the quay wall. It is now proposed to construct a new sheet piled qauy wall along the line of the existing quay wall. It is further proposed to extend this quay wall along the road as far as the southern slipway and along the landward side of the slipway as far as the toe of the slipway

#### where

there is currently rock armor. (This extended quay wall is not on foreshore)

#### (B) A Statement of reason for the works

Burtonport in west Donegal was once one of Ireland's major fishing ports for whitefish, pelagic and lobster but has experienced a significant decline in recent decades and is now dependant on landings of crab, lobster, shrimp and velvet crab by small inshore vessels from a large geographical region which stretches from Rosbeg to Bunbeg while still remaining the busiest port in North-West Donegal. Seaweed continues to be harvested here with processing carried out locally. Burtonport has been for generations the gateway to Arranmore and other offshore islands including Inishfree and Rutland with four roll-on-roll-off ferry vessels operating from here at peak season. Small trawlers from Arranmore Island engaged in crab fishing and herring fishing berth here during winter months and in poor weather conditions while the harbour enjoys leisure activity including charters and visiting yachts throughout the summer months.

A statement of the disturbance to the foreshore, arising from these works, should be attached covering the impact on the marine environment including the impact on coastal erosion, navigation, fishing, fisheries (various species known to inhabit the area), pleasure boating and sailing, air navigation (if appropriate).

(e.g. effluent disposal, removal of derelict or dangerous structures etc.) No, all works will be carried out in a controlled manner with particular regard to the environment and sea life.

10a. Are there public navigational safety implications arising from the proposed works? All mariners and fishermen will be informed of the works in advance with navigation warnings also issued. The work areas will be identified and buoyed off to safeguard vessels in the vicinity.

1. What marine activity is there in the area? Year round fishing of shellfish from Burtonport pier mainly for brown crab but also lobster and velvet crab. Year round ferry operating from here with seasonal charters and leisure activity.

2. How will the marine activity be affected by the proposed works? There will be slight disruption during construction works, however, these works are necessary to safeguard future safe access to the pier. Access will be maintained throughout the works and measures will be taken to prevent any pollution or disruption of nearby foreshore during the works.

3. What mitigating measures will be put in place? Precast concrete caisson units will be used under water to prevent pollution. All plant and equipment will be monitored for leaks and will be maintained in good condition throughout the works.

4. How will the proposed works affect Marine Navigation in the future? There will be no long term impact on navigation as these works involve refurbishment of existing quay wall and provision of pontoons that will greatly enhance safety in the area.

11. Will the works involve the storage and/or disposal of waste? Some construction materials may be stored on site for short periods. All construction waste will be disposed of at licensed facilities. The works will not produce any dredged material or sediment for disposal.\_\_\_\_\_
