## Ear-cropping of Dogs Regulations 2023 S.I. No. 412 of 2023

## Criteria for charities to be listed for sale or supply of dogs with cropped ears after September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

## Charities listed as of 8th April 2024

- 1. DSPCA
- 2. ISPCA
- 3. Dogs Trust
- 4. Wexford SPCA
- 5. Waterford ISPCA
- 6. Roscommon SPCA CLG
- 7. Last Hope Animal Charity
- 8. Clare Animal Welfare

To be eligible to sell/supply dogs with cropped ears, additional charities wishing to be <u>listed after</u> <u>November 1<sup>st</sup> 2023</u>, must fulfil the following criteria:

- 1. Charity is registered with the Charities Regulator.
- 2. Charity has been in operation for at least two years.
- 3. Charity has received DAFM animal welfare grant funding each of the preceding two years.
- 4. Charity to maintain a record of dogs with cropped ears re-homed by the charity.

To include the following details:

- Dog microchip number.
- If ear(s) cropped on admission to charity.
- If, for veterinary reasons, ear/s cropped when under care of charity.
- Name and contact details of new owner/foster carer.
- Date of re-homing.
- Dog licence number.
- 5. Charity must complete and sign Record Form for listed charities selling or supplying a dog with cropped ears. <u>Link: Record Form for Charities</u> Owner/foster carer to also sign completed form. Completed form to be given to owner/foster carer to retain while the dog is in their care.

- 7. The Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine will publish a list of charities approved to sell/supply dogs with cropped ears.
