A contribution of 2% representing the Youth Employment Levy and the Income Levy continues to be payable on all earnings in excess of £13,000.

The Health Contribution, Youth Employment Levy and the Income Levy are each fixed at 1% and are normally included in the employees share of the contribution. However, if the employee has a medical card, the employer pays all three elements.

A full description of the categories of workers in each contribution class is contained in the 'Summary of Social Insurance and Assistance Services' (S.W. 4) or leaflet S.W. 14 which are available free of charge from the Department of Social Welfare.

An Employers Guide to the PRSI system is also available.
