From 6 April 1982 to 5 April 1983, PRSI contributions are payable on the percentage rates shown in the following tables on the amount of earnings up to a ceiling of £9,500.

In addition the 1% Youth Employment Levy continues to be payable on all earnings in excess of £9,500.

The Health contribution and the Youth Employment Levy are each fixed at 1% and are normally included in the employees share of the contribution. However, if the employee has a medical card, the employer pays both elements.

A full description of the categories of workers in each contribution class is contained in the 'Summary of Social Insurance and Assistance Services' (S.W. 4) or leaflet S.W. 14 which are available free of charge from the Department of Social Welfare.
