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

Marine Institute: No comments or issues to address.

Cork County Council:

Mr Tim O'Herlihy, Executive Engineer, Coastal Management & Flood Projects:

"The Schedule provided with the application includes four (4) boreholes, the map six (6) boreholes, the application form refers to six (6) boreholes, the AA Screening Report three (3) and six (6) boreholes and the Supporting Information Report referring to four (4) and six (6) boreholes. Six (6) boreholes is taken as the correct amount of which:

Two (2) boreholes are being drilled on the Foreshore/beach above the low water mark (assumed to be those referred to in the response to 1.6 & 4.4)

Four (4) boreholes are being drilled on the Foreshore below the low water mark

Regarding the four (4) boreholes being drilled below the low water mark which are not addressed in 1.6 & 4.4 are also inadequately addressed in 6.1 & 6.2

White Bay and the deeper waters covered by the application are used by the Royal Cork Yacht Club for racing and for dinghy sailing instruction (particularly in easterly and northerly winds). The racing programme is available here and includes Volvo Cork in July https://www.royalcork.com/events/2018-07/

White Bay and the deeper waters covered by the application are used by Cork Harbour based Angling Charter boats when weather/sea conditions prevent fishing outside the harbour and also by many small boat anglers.

White Bay is included as a Shore Fishing Mark by Inland Fisheries Ireland (see http://www.fishinginireland.info/sea/southwest/cork.htm and http://www.fishinginireland.info/sea/maps/docs/CorkHarbour.doc) and Sea Angling Ireland http://www.sea-angling-ireland.org/shore%20-%20cork%20-%20harbour.htm with shore casting distances reaching Borehole Number TCHB602.

It is recommended that consultation is undertaken with:

- The Royal Cork Yacht Club
- Atlantic Charters on behalf of other Charter Skippers http://www.atlantic-charters.net/"

It should be clarified that Tim's interpretation is correct and there are indeed two boreholes located on the foreshore/beach above the low water mark and the remaining four are below the low water mark (total of 6 no. boreholes).

Please find our responses to the comment from the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine within the aforementioned letter below:

"There are a number of wild fisheries in and around the specific area of this licence application. The fisheries range from annual Velvet Crab/Green Crab fisheries to seasonal Lobster and Brown Crab fisheries. During the site visit there were a number of marker buoys in the area of this application, which corroborated the information provided by local fishermen.

Regarding possible impacts on local wild fisheries, this application will have little or no impact as long as there is effective communication between the operator of the barge and the local fishermen, if there is going to be an exclusion zone put into effect for the duration of the drilling. This will allow fishermen the opportunity to continue to fish during the drilling works.

We are currently in the process of contacting the Royal Yacht Club and the Atlantic Charters who operate within the Cork Harbour area to make both aware of the upcoming works. Both bodies are in contact with fishermen in this area on a daily basis.

Once the relevant contractor is appointed, we as the employer's representative will be conducting a kick off meeting with the contractor where the need to communicate effectively with the local fishermen will also be raised and enforced. Similarly, coming up to the start of the works warning signs will be erected in the vicinity of the proposed works and adjacent to piers and slipways to make the public and fishermen aware of what is being undertaken.

Regarding Impacts, if any, on shellfish growing areas, the report does reference in page 32 that the SFPA website refers the shellfish site in Rostellan as being a 'Dormant Fishery'.

While this is the case presently, the operators of the shellfish site are currently working to have this site re stocked and possibly re-opened. However, at this point and for this application it is very unlikely that the site will open before the works here are completed, as a result there is not likely to be any effect on shellfish growing area."

Please find our responses to the comment from Inland Fisheries Ireland within the aforementioned letter below:

"IFI has no issues with the proposed works set out at items 1 and 3 above.

The works proposed under item 2 (Seismic Surveying) generates and disperses noise into the aquatic environment. The dispersal may be reduced in the present location, due to confinement but this may cause a degree of noise reflection and re-reflection from the adjoining shoreline areas, particularly where these are rocky in nature.

The procedures proposed use instruments that can generate high sound pressure levels with potential for impacts to fish species here but such issues are not addressed in the application.

Mitigation measures in regard to the timing of works and also in regard to noise generation and potential for adverse impact on fish species should be included as conditions in any foreshore licence that may be granted. These mitigations should cover:

- The timing of any seismic surveying shall be agreed in advance with IFI Macroom in the context of migratory fish species using the survey area for access to and from Cork Harbour and tributary rivers. The relevant fish species include Atlantic salmon, sea trout, sea- and river lamprey and European eel.
- The use of soft-start and ramp-up procedures for any sound-generating surveys undertaken - both on a day-to-day basis and on re-start after any stoppages within any
- The duration of noise-generating surveys shall be reduced to the minimum necessary to collect results of sufficient quality."

With regards to the timing of the seismic survey, consultation will be undertaken with IFI Macroom in order to select the most appropriate time to carry out the survey.

It is intended that a soft start approach be undertaken when undertaking the seismic survey i.e. using a lower energy system first and gradually increase the frequency of the survey up to the air gun's necessary frequency. This process gives fish time to vacate the area in which the survey is to take place. This screens out direct harm to fish.

The duration of the survey will be condensed as much as is practical. This seismic survey is required to inform if the geology, sediment cover and composition vary within the survey area where it is envisaged the outfall will be constructed. It is pivotal that robust investigatory works are carried out at this point to ensure an efficient and constructible design is proposed.





Connie,

I have been appointed by Arup to carry out underwater archaeological impact assessments at at Whitegate - Aghada, and Berehaven, Co. Cork.

Both areas measures circa 200m. x 250m. I have recommended that geophysics(complying with National Monuments Service guidelines) be undertaken, as is standard practice for areas this size rather than dive survey alone. Arup have already commissioned a geophysical survey comprising sub-bottom profiling, multi-channel analysis of wave surface and seismic refraction.

Arup are concerned that the recommendations issued by the National Monuments Service for the projects refer to the archaeological survey being carried out in advance of the Site Investigation works. However, I believe that the best option is to include side-scan/ magnetometer surveys as part of the geophysics programme so that the results can inform the Archaeological Impact Assessment.

Taking the above into consideration does the National Monuments Service have any objection to the site investigation contract being carried out in advance of the archaeological assessment?
