

FS006407 Site Specific Conditions for Rosslare Europort Maintenance Dredging and Beach Nourishment

1. The Licensee shall use that part of the Foreshore the subject matter of this licence for the purposes as outlined in the application and for no other purposes whatsoever.
2. The Licensee shall notify the Department of the Environment, Community and Local Government at least 14 days in advance of the commencement of the works on the foreshore.
3. Dredging shall take place within the area of foreshore bounded by the following co-ordinates
 - i. Latitude 52.25846° N Longitude 6.33451° W
 - ii. Latitude 52.25841° N Longitude 6.33464° W
 - iii. Latitude 52.25763° N Longitude 6.33692° W
 - iv. Latitude 52.25763° N Longitude 6.33750° W
 - v. Latitude 52.25724° N Longitude 6.33793° W
 - vi. Latitude 52.25697° N Longitude 6.33824° W
 - vii. Latitude 52.25627° N Longitude 6.33644° W
 - viii. Latitude 52.25612° N Longitude 6.33658° W
 - ix. Latitude 52.25590° N Longitude 6.33680° W
 - x. Latitude 52.25589° N Longitude 6.33734° W
 - xi. Latitude 52.25659° N Longitude 6.33912° W
4. The placement of the material dredged from the area specified at (3) above shall take place within the area of foreshore bounded by the following co-ordinates
 - i. Latitude 52.269830° N Longitude 6.374670° W
 - ii. Latitude 52.271170° N Longitude 6.367340° W
 - iii. Latitude 52.268160° N Longitude 6.365340° W
 - iv. Latitude 52.266660° N Longitude 6.373000° W
5. The Licensee shall arrange the publication of a local marine notice giving a general description of operations and approximate dates of commencement and completion. An advertisement in a locally read newspaper will suffice.

6. The Licensee shall ensure that all vessels engaged in the works comply with all certification requirements and an Irish Load line shall be required for any vessel operating outside Harbour limits.

7. The Licensee shall ensure that all works are completed in accordance with the drawings and documents submitted in support of the licence application.
