Funding boost for West Cork Development Partnership

WEST Cork Development Partnership (WCDP) has been granted an additional 6333,858 under the Department of the Environment's Rural Development Programme 2007—2013.

The funding is being targeted at both the Gaeltacht areas and also to the areas which experienced a reduction of greater than 15% in the revised allocation awarded in May 2013.

At the time, WCDP's Leader budget was reduced by €2.4ma decision described as 'unacceptable' by WCDP chief executive Ian Demosey.

Skibbereen Animal Rescue Centre awarded €10,000

SKIBBEREEN Animal Rescue Centre has been awarded £10,000 in funding from Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney, who announced £1.8m in funding to 136 organisations involved in animal care and welfare services throughout the country.

The payments will be made with immediate effect, with the Community Cats Network in Glanavaud, Kilbrittain also benefitting to the tune of €1,200.

Minister Coveney said that the overall level of funding being provided has increased for the third year in a ring reflact tification and equine premises

The minister said that 2013 has been a challenging year for animal welfare organisations, and said recent reports of animal cruelty have highlighted the need to help animal welfare organisations. He also referred to the danger of animals being gifted at Christmas time only to be subsequently abandoned, describing the practice as 'not acceptable'.
