## Re: Foreshore Licence Application by CETO Wave Energy Ireland Ltd in respect of Site Investigation works between Freagh Point and Spanish Point, Co. Clare

In accordance with the requirements stated in your letter of 12 June 2012 regarding CWE Ireland's application for a Foreshore Licence to undertake Site Investigation works, I can confirm that CWE Ireland have met all of the requirements for public consultation.

CWE Ireland published a Public Notice relating to the proposed works in the Irish Times and Clare Champion on 2 August 2012 and 3 August 2012 respectively. (Enclosures A and B). CWE Ireland also made available a copy of the Foreshore Licence application, relevant maps, reports, plans and drawing at the Ennistymon Garda Station in Ennistymon, Co. Clare. This was made available from 2 August 2012 until 28 September 2012 (Enclosure C). The Foreshore Application was also made available on CWE Ireland's website ( www.cweireland.ie) and on the Department's website.

During the public consultation period, CWE Ireland received six formal responses via the Department which are outlined below along with CWE Ireland's commitments to support the Licence Application. No other responses were received.
