# 10a. Are there public navigational safety implications arising from the proposed works?

None Anticipated. The Port of Cork were consulted in this regard.

### 1. What marine activity is there in the area?

A swing mooring field is located within the footprint of the marina and surrounding area. A public slipway to the west of the development is used by the general public and Cove Sailing Club for launching and recovering small vessels. The Port of Cork cruise liner turning basin is located to the east of the development.

# 2. How will the marine activity be affected by the proposed works?

The proposed works will provide additional and safer marina berthage space within Cork Harbour. The existing swing moorings within the footprint of the marina and the immediate surrounding area will be removed to accommodate the development. The public slipway to the west of the development will benefit from the increased level of shelter provided by the proposed marina. The Port of Cork cruise liner operations will not be affected by the development, as they were consulted regarding the proximity of the development to their turning basin.

## 3. What mitigating measures will be put in place?

The users of existing swing moorings that will be affected by the development will be encouraged to relocate to the new marina, which will provide safer sheltered year round berthing. The marina design has been refined to ensure that a minimum distance of 65m be maintained between the turning basin and nearest point of the marina following extensive consultations with the Port of Cork. Navigation lighting will be placed on the pontoon to the specifications of the Marine Survey Office and the Commissioner of Irish Lights.

\*Certain developments are subject to the European Communities (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations, 1989 to 1999. #### Any additional Information

#### Section 2B:

The development of this marina will have minimal impact on the foreshore:

#### Pleasure Boating and Sailing

The proposed marina is located in the site of an existing swing mooring field. Many of the users are members of Cove Sailing Club. The swing mooring field presents many issues in relation to health and safety and access to vessels. The proposed works will provide safe, all tide access, mooring facilities for recreational and sailing vessels.

#### Navigation

The proposed marina will provide much needed, safe, all tide access berths. It is expected that many of the users of existing swing moorings in the area will move their vessels into the marina. Navigation in this part of Cork Harbour includes commercial shipping, leisure sailing and rowing. All of the organisations representing these activities have been consulted and are in support of the development.

#### Fishing Activities

There is no known commercial or leisure fishing activities in the area of the proposed marina.

#### Fisheries

The potential marine species that may inhabit the area are as follows:

⇒ Sea Sponges

⇒ Velvet Swimming Crab

⇒ Plumose Anemones

⇒ Snake Pipefish

⇒ Flounders

⇒ Mussels

→ Flounders

⇒ Common Prawn

⇔ Common Brittlestars

The proposed development will have little, if any impact on the above species as it will not involve any dredging and the form of construction of both the marina and access platform will have a minimal footprint on the seabed (please see enclosed Natura Impact Statement & Appropriate Assessment Screening).

#### Coastal Erosion

The Cobh Town Council car park and public walkway, connecting to the marina access platform, is currently protected by a vertical stone seawall. The proposed marina and access platform will not have any adverse impact on the hydrodynamic regime in the area.

#### Air Navigation

Air Navigation will not be affected by the proposed development.

#### Maritime Cultural Heritage

The site is of low maritime cultural heritage value. It is unlikely that there will be any negative impact on maritime cultural heritage (please see Maritime Cultural Heritage Assessment).

#### Section 11:

Foul water will be generated from two sources at the proposed development: shower and toilet facilities at the dinghy park; and the pump out unit at the marina. It is proposed to treat these effluents with an on-site package treatment plant before discharging to the existing public foul water drainage system at Whitepoint Moorings.

Solid waste streams will be catered for by the provision of dedicated waste receptacles, which be located at the Cove Sailing Club Dinghy Park. A bank of waste receptacle bins will have provisions for the following waste streams:

- ⇒ Hazardous (batteries, etc.)
- ⇒ Recyclables (paper, plastic, glass, etc.)
- ⇒ Refuse (general refuse)

The waste facilities will be managed and operated in accordance with Cobh Town Council requirements. A licensed waste collection company will be appointed to collect all waste streams.
