

TRADER NOTICE No. 4 of 2017

To: All registered importers of plant and plant produce

Subject: Commencement of electronic issuing of Clearance Certificates for consignments of plant and plant produce from Third Countries (non EU countries), into Dublin Airport

Having regard to Council Directive 2000/29/EC on protective measures against the introduction into the Community of organisms harmful to plant or plant products and against their spread within the Community; the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM) is introducing the following procedural changes:

With effect from Thursday 22/06/17, the practice of issuing hard copies of Clearance Certificates to registered importers or their handling agents for consignment arriving at **Dublin Airport** will discontinue.

From 22/06/17 Clearance Certificates will be issued via email to Customs (see copy attached) and copied to the registered importer or their handling agent. This new procedure has been agreed with Customs.

<u>Confirmation of Arrival – New Arrangements</u>

From 22/06/2017 the system of contacting a DAFM official by telephone to confirm the arrival of a consignment into Dublin Airport will no longer be acceptable. To improve efficiencies and minimise delays in the clearance of consignments, registered importers or their handling agents will be required to submit an email to DAFM confirming that their consignment has arrived at Dublin Airport.

In order for DAFM to arrange for a consignment to be inspected an email must first be received at phibipairport@agriculture.gov.ie

The email must include the following documentation relevant to the consignment:

- Completed Confirmation of Arrival of Consignment (CAC) Form (attached)
- Colorado Beetle Licence
- Phytosanitary certificate (where applicable)
- Invoice
- Airway Bill

The Subject line of each email must contain the Colorado Beetle (CB) Licence number, together with the PHR number of the Importer as it appears on the CB Licence e.g. CB\1234\15, PHR No:4321

The original phytosanitary certificate for each consignment will still be required to be received and verified by DAFM prior to clearance.

Omissions of any of the above documents may lead to delays in processing. In cases where the details of these documents are **not legible** they will be returned.

Please note that registered importers or their agents must ensure that the Customs Single Administrative Document (SAD) number and SAD date detailed on each CAC form submitted is valid, by correctly following Customs procedures.

Please note that the process for applying for Colorado Beetle (CB) Licences will remain unchanged. Registered importers should continue to submit Plant Importation Request (PIR) Forms to the dedicated email address plantimports@agriculture.gov.ie a minimum of 3 working days prior to the arrival of each consignment.

These revised procedures for the declaration of arrival of consignments as outlined above apply only to Dublin Airport.

The Colorado Beetle (CB) Licence number and the PHR number must be cited in the subject line of the email.

Completed forms should only be submitted once the consignment has arrived at the point of entry.
