

TRADER NOTICE No. 7 OF 2015

To: All registered importers of plant and plant produce

Subject: Reintroduction of the system of fees for the inspection of plant and plant produce imported from Third Countries (non EU countries), as required under Article 13(d) of Directive 2000/29/EC

The Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM) are obliged, under Article 13(d) of Directive 2000/29/EC on protective measures against the introduction into the Community of organisms harmful to plants or plant products, to apply a system of charges for inspections carried out on regulated plant and plant products introduced into the State from Third Countries. A list of the plants and plant products which come under the remit of this Directive are listed in Annex A of this Notice.

With effect from the **1st September 2015**, all consignments of plants and plant products listed in Annex A of this notice entering the State from Third Countries will be subject to an Inspection Charge, <u>based on the schedule of charges as set out in Annex B of this notice</u>. The charge will apply to imported consignments arriving in both Dublin Port and Dublin Airport.

Application of Fees:

Each Inspection Charge comprises (a) documentary check fee, (b) an identity check fee and (c) a plant health check fee based on the volume/quantity of material as set out in Annex B of this Notice. Note: A consignment is defined as per Article 2(1) (p) of Directive 2000/29/EC.

"consignment shall be considered to mean: A quantity of goods being covered by a single document required for customs formalities or for other formalities, such as a single phytosanitary certificate or a single alternative document or mark; a consignment may be composed of one or more lots."

Invoicing:

To reduce administrative burden, registered importers will be invoiced once in the second week of the month for all consignments inspected in the preceding calendar month, i.e. all inspections carried out in September 2015 will be the subject of an invoice issued by DAFM in the second week of October 2015.

Payment:

Details of the methods by which payments can be made shall accompany each invoice. A remittance slip will be provided with each invoice for your convenience. Please ensure that you quote your customer number, located at the top left of the invoice, together with the invoice number when completing the remittance slip.

Payment by cheque, draft or money order (in Euro only) should be made payable to:

The remittance slip together with payment should be forwarded to:

Remittances should be sent to this address only. Failure to do so may result in delays in the registering of payments (see non payments below).

EFT/Credit/Debit Card Payments:

A facility to make payments by EFT or credit/debit card can only be made in accordance with a set protocol.

Non-payments:

As provided for under Regulation 16(2) of SI 894 of 2004, the Department reserves the right to refuse to carry out inspections of plant and plant products where registered importers have failed to clear outstanding accounts within an eight-week period from the date of the relevant invoice date.

Phytosanitary Certificates:

Registered importers are reminded of the provisions of Trader Notice 4 of 2015 and specifically; the requirement of ensuring that the original Phytosanitary Certificate for each consignment is received by DAFM within **five working days** of DAFM issuing the associated Clearance Certificate. Failure to do so may result in delays to issuing of CB licences for subsequent import applications.

PLANTS, PLANT PRODUCTS AND OTHER OBJECTS ORIGINATING IN TERRITORIES, OTHER THAN THOSE TERRITORIES REFERRED TO IN PART A

 - Castanea Mill., Dendranthema (DC.) Des Moul., Dianthus L., Gypsophila L., Pelargonium l'Herit. ex Ait, Phoenix spp., Populus L., Quercus L., Solidago L. and cut flowers of Orchidaceae,
 - conifers (Coniferales),
 - Acer saccharum Marsh., originating in the USA and Canada,
 - Prunus L., originating in non-European countries,
 - Cut flowers of Aster spp., Eryngium L., Hypericum L., Lisianthus L., Rosa L. and Trachelium L., originating in non-European countries,
 - Leafy vegetables of Apium graveolens L., Ocimum L., Limnophila L. and Eryngium L.,
 - Leaves of Manihot esculenta Crantz,
 - Cut branches of *Betula* L. with or without foliage,
 - Cut branches of *Fraxinus L., Juglans ailantifolia* Carr., *Juglans mandshurica* Maxim., *Ulmus davidiana* Planch. and *Pterocarya rhoifolia* Siebold & Zucc., with or without foliage, originating in Canada, China, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Japan, Mongolia, Republic of Korea, Russia, Taiwan and USA,
 - Amiris P. Browne, Casimiroa La Llave, Citropsis Swingle & Kellerman, Eremocitrus Swingle, Esenbeckia Kunth., Glycosmis Corrêa, Merrillia Swingle, Naringi Adans., Tetradium Lour., Toddalia Juss. and Zanthoxylum L.
 - 2.1 Parts of plants, other than fruits but including seeds, of *Aegle* Corrêa, *Aeglopsis* Swingle, *Afraegle* Engl., *Atalantia* Corrêa, *Balsamocitrus* Stapf, *Burkillanthus* Swingle, *Calodendrum* Thunb., *Choisya* Kunth, *Clausena* Burm. f., *Limonia* L., *Microcitrus* Swingle, *Murraya* J. Koenig ex L., *Pamburus* Swingle, *Severinia* Ten., *Swinglea* Merr., *Triphasia* Lour and *Vepris* Comm.
